Document 15.1 provides a brief description of the efforts the Pension Plan has taken to contact active participants, retirces, beneficiaries in pay status, and alternate payees. Document 15.2 provides a copy of the web site and related materials of Pension Benefit Information, Inc. (PBI), the commercial locater service that the Pension Plan uses to assist in its efforts to locate missing individuals.

4.05(2) Efforts to Contact Eligible Recipients

Document 15.1

The Pension Plan's Efforts to Contact Active Participants, Retirees, Beneficiaries in Pay Status, and Alternate Payces

As required by the IRS regulations, the Pension Plan has provided notices of the proposed suspension to the following eligible recipients:

- 1. All active participants, retirees, beneficiaries of deceased participants, and alternate payees, regardless of whether their benefits are proposed to be suspended;
- 2. Each employer that has an obligation to contribute to the Pension Plan; and
- 3. Each employee organization that, for purposes of collective bargaining, represents the participants employed by each such employer.

Only written notices about the proposed suspension were sent to the recipients; no electronic notices were sent out. The Pension Plan also established an informative website at http://www.bricklayers7rescue.com. Recipients were told to access the website for timely information, FAQs, a video clip from a town hall meeting held in Akron, Ohio on May 23, 2016, and other helpful online materials.

To find missing individuals, the Fund Office and Fund counsel used Internet search tools. They also used a commercial locator service that has access to commercial and credit reporting databases. In addition, they contacted the local union's representatives for information about missing individuals, and Fund counsel contacted the management trustees and union trustees for any contact information of such individuals. Local unions also were contacted through the union's district council office. In one situation, the missing person was in pay status receiving automatic deposits, so the Fund Office contacted the receiving financial institution to ask for assistance with contacting the missing individual. Court databases also were reviewed to discover that one of the missing persons had recently lost his primary residence in a sheriff's sale.

As of May 27, 2016, the Pension Plan had only two (2) missing individuals. Participant A, a 38-year-old unmarried male, did not have a current mailing address on file with the Fund Office. Recent Pension Plan mailings, as well as two mailings relating to the proposed suspension, were sent to him at two different addresses, but both mailings were returned to the Fund Office as undeliverable and with no forwarding address. In response, the Fund Office contacted Pension Benefit Information, Inc. (PBI) (see Document 15.2) to assist in its efforts to locate Participant A. Fund counsel also performed several online searches to locate Participant A, but to no avail. In addition, Fund counsel used Lexis Advance to search public records to find Participant A's current mailing address. The Fund Office and PBI searched death records and the databases of several credit reporting agencies and commercial locator services. When those attempts to locate Participant A failed, the Fund Office and Fund counsel asked for information from the union's business representative. Fund counsel also contacted the Pension Plan's trustees for additional information about Participant A. Meanwhile, the Fund Office contacted other eligible recipients with the same last name, in the hopes that they were related to Participant A and could provide the

Fund Office his current contact information. None of those individuals could provide any assistance in locating Participant A. As of May 27, 2016, Participant A remained missing under the Pension Plan.

Another missing person was Participant B, a 77-year-old retiree who lost his primary residence on September 11, 2015, in a sheriff's sale at the Summit County Court of Common Pleas in Akron, Ohio. Unfortunately, recent Pension Plan mailings, as well as two mailings relating to the proposed suspension, were sent to Participant B, but they came back as undeliverable and with no forwarding address. The Fund Office contacted the financial institution that had requested the sheriff's sale, but the financial institution's attorney did not have a new or updated forwarding address for Participant B. The Fund Office also contacted PBI to assist in its efforts to locate Participant B. Meanwhile, Fund counsel looked online and did several online searches to try to find Participant B's current mailing address. When those attempts to locate Participant B failed, the Fund Office and Fund counsel asked for information from the union's business representative. Fund counsel also contacted the Pension Plan's trustees for additional information about Participant B. None of those individuals could provide any assistance in locating Participant B. As of May 27, 2016, Participant B remained missing under the Pension Plan.

The Pension Plan will continue its efforts to find all missing individuals, including Participants A and B. If the Pension Plan were to find missing Participants A and B, the Fund Office would send them their estimates immediately. But at this point, the Board of Trustees of the Pension Plan, Fund counsel, and the Plan's professionals are confident that all reasonable measures have been taken to contact all eligible recipients, and that all eligible recipients have received notices about the proposed suspension, except for those who could not be contacted by reasonable efforts.
