

Capital Projects Fund Award Fact Sheet Colorado

Treasury approves Colorado's plan to invest \$162.2 million of CPF funding in broadband infrastructure projects that will provide high-quality internet to locations that lack access to adequate service.

Colorado Capital Projects Fund Program Overview

- Program Summary: \$162.2 million for Broadband Infrastructure (100% of program allocation)
- Locations to Be Served: 18,000 (estimated)
- Program Description: The Advance Colorado Broadband (ACB) grant program is a competitive grant program designed to deploy broadband internet service to households, businesses, community anchor institutions, and agricultural operations that currently lack access to reliable broadband that can meet or exceed 25/3 Mbps.

As reported by Colorado, estimates show that investments made using the Capital Projects Fund will serve ~15% of locations still lacking high-speed internet access in the state.

This program aims to prioritize projects that connect areas of the state with the lowest levels of broadband access with last-mile infrastructure.

- The program is designed to provide internet service with speeds of 100/100 Mbps symmetrical to households and businesses upon project completion.
- Each of the internet service providers funded by the program will participate in the FCC's
 Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) a \$30 per month subsidy for low-income families.
