



Treasury approves North Carolina's plan to invest \$177.7 million of CPF funding in broadband infrastructure projects that will provide high-quality internet to locations that lack access to adequate service.

North Carolina Capital Projects Fund Program Overview

- Program Summary: \$177.7 million for Broadband Infrastructure (65% of CPF allocation)
- Locations to Be Served: 78,100 (estimated)
- Program Description: The Completing Access to Broadband (CAB) program is a competitive grant program that aims to create a partnership between the state, counties, and internet providers to build broadband infrastructure and provide service to areas that lack adequate access to internet.

As reported by North Carolina, estimates show that investments made using the Capital Projects Fund will serve ~14% of locations still lacking highspeed internet access in the state.

- The program is designed to provide internet service with speeds of 100/100 Mbps symmetrical to households and businesses upon project completion.
- Each of the internet service providers funded by the program will participate in the FCC's <u>Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP)</u> – a \$30 per month subsidy for low-income families.
