

## Capital Projects Fund Award Fact Sheet Nevada

Treasury approves Nevada's plan to invest \$55.2 million of CPF funding in broadband infrastructure projects that will provide high-quality internet to locations that lack access to adequate service.

## **Nevada Capital Projects Fund Program Overview**

- Program Summary: \$55.2 million for Broadband Infrastructure (41% of CPF allocation)
- Locations to Be Served: 40,187 (estimated)
- Program Description: Nevada's Low-Income Multi-Dwelling Units (MDU) Broadband Program is a competitive grant program designed to fund broadband infrastructure to and within low-income housing. CPF funds will be used to upgrade internet access in MDUs.

As reported by Nevada, estimates show that investments made using the Capital Projects Fund will serve ~16% of locations still lacking high-speed internet access in the state.

- The program is designed to provide internet service with speeds of 100/100 Mbps symmetrical to households upon project completion.
- Each of the internet service providers funded by the program will participate in the FCC's
  Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) a \$30 per month subsidy for low-income families.
