Missouri

Treasury approves Missouri's plan to invest \$196.7 million of CPF funding in broadband infrastructure projects that will provide high-quality internet to locations that lack access to adequate service.

Missouri Capital Projects Fund Program Overview

- **Program Summary:** \$196.7 million for Broadband Infrastructure (100% of CPF allocation)
- **Locations to Be Served:** 37,979 (estimated)
- **Program Description:** The Missouri Broadband Infrastructure Grant Program is a competitive grant program designed to fund broadband infrastructure projects in areas that currently lack access to high-speed, reliable broadband. This program utilizes CPF funds to bring service to areas where broadband infrastructure projects would not be feasible without assistance.
 - The program is designed to provide internet service with speeds of 100/100 Mbps symmetrical to households and businesses upon project completion.
 - Each of the internet service providers funded by the program will participate in the FCC's [Affordable Connectivity Program \(ACP\)](#) – a \$30 per month subsidy for low-income families.
- **Key State Contact:** Missouri Department of Economic Development (DED)

As reported by Missouri, estimates show that investments made using the Capital Projects Fund will serve ~8% of locations still lacking high-speed internet access in the state.
