Treasury approves Kansas' plan to invest \$14.7 million of CPF funding in Digital Connectivity Technology projects that aim to address gaps in digital equity, affordability, and broadband adoption.

Kansas Capital Projects Fund Program Overview

- **Program Summary:** \$14.7 million for Digital Connectivity Technology (10% of CPF allocation)
- **Individuals to Be Served:** 12,579 (estimated)
- **Program Description:** The Kansas Digital Technology Connectivity (DTC) program is a competitive grant program that aims to address gaps in digital equity, affordability, and broadband adoption by investing in public Wi-Fi infrastructure, digital devices, and digital literacy training resources. The DTC program will improve broadband access and affordability by targeting public Wi-Fi investments, including access points, repeaters, and routers, to economically distressed communities with low rates of broadband access and adoption. The program will also provide laptops, tablets, and other Wi-Fi-enabled devices to lower affordability barriers and increase adoption. Kansas will rely on several studies that have analyzed the lack of affordable broadband options in many areas of the state to identify communities with critical needs.
