Maryland

Treasury approves Maryland's plan to invest \$24.2 million of CPF funding in broadband infrastructure projects that will provide high-quality internet to locations that lack access to adequate service.

Maryland Capital Projects Fund Program Overview

- **Program Summary:** \$24.2 million for Broadband Infrastructure (14% of CPF allocation)
- **Locations to Be Served:** 4800 (estimated)
- **Program Description:** The Broadband for Difficult to Serve Premises Program is a new competitive grant program designed to bring high-speed internet access to locations that have difficulty obtaining service based on geographic barriers by connecting such difficult to serve premises to an existing broadband network.
 - This program is designed to provide internet service with speeds of 100/100 Mbps upon project completion.
 - Internet service providers utilizing investments funded by CPF will be required to participate in the FCC's [Affordable Connectivity Program \(ACP\)](#) – a \$30 per month subsidy for low-income families.
- **Key State Contact:** The Maryland Office of Statewide Broadband (OSB)

As reported by Maryland, estimates show that investments made using the Capital Projects Fund will serve ~6% of locations still lacking high-speed internet access in the state.
