Michigan

Treasury approves Michigan's plan to invest \$250.6 million of CPF funding in broadband infrastructure projects that will provide high-quality internet to locations that lack access to adequate service.

Michigan Capital Projects Fund Program Overview

- **Program Summary:** \$250.6 million for Broadband Infrastructure (100% of CPF allocation)
- **Locations to Be Served:** 67,857 (estimated)
- **Program Description:** Michigan's Realizing Opportunity with Broadband Infrastructure Networks (ROBIN) program is a competitive grant program designed to provide funding to extend broadband infrastructure and service to locations currently lacking access to at least 100/20 Mbps.
 - ROBIN is designed to provide internet service with speeds of 100/100 Mbps symmetrical to households and businesses upon project completion.
 - Each of the internet service providers funded by ROBIN will participate in the FCC's [Affordable Connectivity Program \(ACP\)](#) – a \$30 per month subsidy for low-income families.
- **Key State Contact:** The Michigan High Speed Internet Office (MIHI) within the Michigan Department of Labor and Economic Opportunity (LEO)

*As reported by Michigan, estimates show that investments made using the Capital Projects Fund will serve **23% of locations** still lacking high-speed internet access in the state.*
