New Jersey Capital Projects Fund Program Overview

Program Summary: \$6.6 million for a Multi-Purpose Community Facility (3% of CPF allocation)

 Program Description: The City of Newark-North Jersey Community Research Initiative Homeless Drop-In Center will service the area's homeless population by providing shelter, meals, and facilities for personal hygiene in addition New Jersey estimates the drop-in center will benefit more than 200 individuals daily.

to programming and services that directly meet the CPF program goals. The center will provide healthcare services such as COVID testing and vaccines, referrals for primary care, treatment for substance abuse, and educational workshops addressing physical and mental health. The facility will provide public access to high-speed internet to enable individuals to apply for jobs, conduct and follow-up on interviews, take classes, and conduct other activities related to work, education, and health monitoring. The facility will also work with the City of Newark's Workforce Development Board to provide vocational services and assist individuals finding work. NewarkWORKS, the City of Newark's employment and training agency, will have staff onsite to provide and connect individuals to specific training including Basic Skills Education, GED/High School Equivalency, and Vocational Training at Essex County College.
