Treasury approves Ohio's plan to invest \$89.5 million of CPF funding in multi-purpose community facilities to improve resources for communities that enable work, education, and health monitoring.

Ohio's Capital Projects Fund Program Overview

- Program Summary: \$89.5 million for Multi-Purpose Community Facilities (33% of CPF allocation)
- Program Description: Ohio's Appalachian Community Innovation Campuses Program is a competitive grant program that provides funding to eligible counties within the Appalachian region to construct multi-purpose facilities designed to increase access to education, community health services, and workforce development

Ohio estimates this program will fund up to 5 Community Innovation Campuses.

opportunities. Each campus will provide public education to students across a minimum of six grade levels, health services in partnership with a healthcare provider, and a return-to-work site with internet access.
