City of Orlando, Florida 2022 Recovery Plan

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GENERAL OVERVIEW

Executive Summary

The City of Orlando, Florida ("City") was allocated, and has received, approximately \$58 million in American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA") funding.

Through June 30, 2022, there were no expenditures of the City's ARPA funding.

On July 18, 2022, the City held a public workshop with a plan to use the entire ARPA allocation for government services, under the (EC 6) Revenue Replacement Expenditure Category. On July 25, 2022, the City of Orlando's Budget Review Committee, ("BRC") approved allocating and appropriating the entire ARPA allocation to government services. The City Council is anticipated to approve the proposed appropriation in August 2022.

The proposal to use the ARPA allocation to fund government services will allow the City to leverage \$58M in general revenues to fund projects (titled "Accelerate Orlando") focused on:

- Affordable, bridge, and permanent supportive housing/homelessness
- Economic Opportunity (RISE job training program)
- Broadband Access (Bridging digital divide)
- Gun Violence Reduction program
- Contingency/Legal/Project Management/Administrative

Uses of Funds

Through June 30, 2022, the City has not obligated or spent any of its ARPA funding.

On July 18, 2022, a public workshop was held proposing to use the entire ARPA allocation to fund government services under the (EC 6) Revenue Replacement Expenditure Category. Funds would be allocated to departments based on their allocable headcount.

The City has successfully leveraged other Federal funding, including, such as the , , Emergency Rental Assistance Program, ("ERAP")—rounds one and two, to support a strong and equitable recovery and help those most affected by COVID. The first round of ERAP funding was exhausted by December 31, 2021. The City closed its Emergency Rental Assistance program to applications on July 1, 2022, and is projected to exhaust its ERAP Round 2 funds after eligible applicants have been assisted.

Promoting equitable outcomes

On July 18, 2022, the City held a public workshop with a plan to use the entire ARPA allocation for government services, under the (EC 6) Revenue Replacement Expenditure Category. On July 25, 2022, the City of Orlando's Budget Review Committee, ("BRC") approved allocating and appropriating the entire ARPA allocation to government services. The proposal to use the ARPA allocation to fund government services will allow the City to leverage \$58M in general revenues to fund these projects as well as others under the City's "Accelerate Orlando" program.
