

ECIP Applicants Affected by Hurricane Ida

The deadline to submit an application for investment through the Emergency Capital Investment Program (ECIP) is Wednesday, September 1, 2021 at 11:59 PM ET.

Prospective ECIP applicants may request a seven-day extension of the application deadline if they are unable to submit a timely application due directly to the impacts of Hurricane Ida. To request an application deadline extension, an applicant must:

- Submit a request to Treasury in writing (such as by e-mail) that explains why it cannot submit its application by the September 1, 2021, deadline, such as whether (1) the applicant's offices were closed or without electricity for a significant period; (2) staff members were not able to work on the application during critical periods; or (3) application partners (e.g., consultants, community partners) were not able to provide materials critical to the compilation of the application; and
- State that the applicant's headquarters or principal place of business are in, or the applicant has been materially affected by disaster-related conditions in, a parish or county that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has designated as affected by a "major disaster" declared since August 29, 2021.¹

If the circumstances that led to the extension request continue after seven days, prospective applicants may request an extension of an additional seven days by submitting a request, consistent with the requirements above, regarding the continued impact of the disaster on the applicant. All initial requests for extensions must be submitted by Wednesday, September 8, 2021 at 5:00 p.m. Eastern Time.
