

## Capital Projects Fund Award Fact Sheet Texas

Treasury approves Texas' plan to invest \$22.8 million of CPF funding in broadband infrastructure projects that will provide high-quality internet to locations that lack access to adequate service.

## **Texas Capital Projects Fund Program Overview**

- Program Summary: \$22.8 million for Broadband Infrastructure (5% of CPF allocation)
- Program Description: The Texas Rural Hospital Broadband Program is a grant program designed to build fiber to selected facilities, provide devices such as computers and workstations on wheels, install public Wi-Fi, and upgrade facilities to expand access to telehealth services in rural areas, promote educational opportunities among staff and patients, and increase access to workforce training.
  - This program is designed to provide internet service with speeds of 100/100 Mbps upon project completion.
  - Internet service providers utilizing investments funded by CPF will be required to participate in the FCC's <u>Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP)</u> – a \$30 per month subsidy for low-income families.
