



Treasury approves Wisconsin's plan to invest \$27.8 million of CPF funding in Digital Connectivity Technology projects that aim to address gaps in digital equity, affordability, and broadband adoption.

Wisconsin Capital Projects Fund Program Overview

- Program Summary: \$27.8 million for Digital Connectivity Technology (15% of CPF allocation)
- Program Description: Wisconsin's Device Deployment and Digital Navigators program will enable non-profits and other eligible entities to apply for grants to deploy devices, including computers, laptops, and tablets to targeted households through a loan program. The loaned devices will be internet-enabled devices that allow users to engage in work,

Wisconsin estimates this program will serve more than 20,000 households.

education, and health monitoring. Subrecipients will provide digital literacy training and support to ensure that users are able to connect the device to the internet and make full use of the technology. In addition, grants can also be used to purchase and install equipment necessary to deploy Wi-Fi in multi-dwelling units with low-income or low adoption households to provide affordable internet access.
