Treasury approves Wisconsin's plan to invest \$115 million of CPF funding in multi-purpose community facilities to improve resources for communities that enable work, education, and health monitoring.

## **Wisconsin Capital Projects Fund Program Overview**

- Program Summary: \$115 million for Multi-Purpose Community Facilities (61% of CPF allocation)
- Program Description: Wisconsin's Flexible Facilities
   Program will provide grants to local and Tribal
   governments for purposes of enabling work,
   education, and healthcare monitoring in public
   libraries and community centers to address the

Wisconsin estimates this program will fund a minimum of 25 projects that will serve more than 250,000 individuals.

- needs of residents living in communities disproportionately impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Eligible projects include construction and/or renovation of buildings and purchase of technology and equipment to promote connectivity and enable those public libraries and community centers to facilitate work, education, and health monitoring.
