

Capital Projects Fund Award Fact Sheet Wisconsin

Treasury approves Wisconsin's plan to invest \$42 million of CPF funding in broadband infrastructure projects that will provide high-quality internet to locations that lack access to adequate service.

Wisconsin Capital Projects Fund Program Overview

- Program Summary: \$42 million for Broadband Infrastructure (21% of CPF allocation)
- Locations to Be Served: 8,000 (estimated)
- Program Description: Wisconsin's Broadband Infrastructure Projects program is a competitive grant program that aims to invest in broadband infrastructure projects designed to provide consistent, reliable service to households in Wisconsin that currently lack consistent speeds of 100/20 Mbps.
 - The program is designed to provide internet service with speeds of 100/100 Mbps symmetrical to locations upon project completion.
 - Each of the internet service providers funded by the program will participate in the FCC's
 <u>Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP)</u> a \$30 per month subsidy for low-income families.

On May 15, 2023, Treasury approved Wisconsin's request to increase the funding from \$40M to \$42M. This fact sheet reflects these changes.
