As an update to the St. Charles Parish's RESTORE Act Multiyear Implementation Plan (MIP) Initial Plan which was accepted by Treasury on 01/17/2018. This amendment adds one project to the parish's MIP, The Des Allemands Boat Launch located along Bayou Des Allemands in Des Allemands, Louisiana.

Description: The Des Allemands Boat Launch project involves the construction of a new boat launch facility to provide enhanced recreational access to the surrounding natural environment. The total construction cost of the project is estimated to be \$4,845,293.98.

The scope of the project includes the following elements:

- A 4,873-foot-long × 22-foot-wide limestone access road with adjacent drainage improvements for boat ramp traffic from Louisiana Highway 632 to the parking lot (480 feet paved with asphalt at turnoff)
- A paved (asphalt) parking lot with up to 60 spaces large enough to accommodate a vehicle with a trailer as well as 16 single car spaces, four of which would be ADA compliant and two paved access roads (dimensions TBD; est. 30 feet wide x 260 feet long per road) on either side of the parking lot providing access to the four launch ramps at Bayou Des Allemands
- Four concrete boat launch ramps (final dimensions TBD; est. 90-foot-long × 12-foot-wide) with an adjacent approximately 14,400-square-foot maneuvering area and three 50-footlong × 8-foot-wide (400-square-foot each) wooden docks constructed of treated wood
- Two 100-foot-long × 7-foot-wide fishing piers constructed of treated wood
- Two 4-foot-wide ADA-compliant concrete walkways (length TBD; est. 270 feet per walkway) for foot traffic from the fishing pier to the parking area

The proposed site is surrounded by over 250,000 acres of open water and marshland and centrally located near the area's major lakes, Lake Des Allemands and Lake Salvador. It also offers adequate space for a multifaceted recreation area, which will be developed in future phases.

Funding: St. Charles Parish has entered into an intergovernmental agreement with The Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority through the National Resource Damage Assessment for \$1,841,116. Chevron USA has donated land for the project site which appraised for \$350,000 in 2021. We are requesting \$514,008.95 in RESTORE Direct Component funds for the construction costs. The remainder of the expenses will be funded through the St. Charles Parish Special Revenue Fund.

Need: Des Allemands, known as the Catfish Capital of the World, has a rich heritage as a fisherman's paradise. Early settlers relied on fishing and trapping as a way of life and today, many residents continue this cultural lifestyle. The local economy benefits from several factories situated along the bayou's banks, where fishermen can directly sell their catch from their boats. Additionally, the surrounding waters attract numerous boaters on weekends, engaging in activities such as fishing, trawling, and leisurely cruising. St. Charles Parish lacks the adequate boating infrastructure to access the abundance of lakes, waterways, and marshes the southwest region of the parish offers. The proposed Des Allemands Boat Launch is the solution to serve the demand in this area.

The existing public launch nearest to the proposed project site is in Des Allemands on Down the Bayou Road. Only a single ramp is offered with very limited parking available in a state-owned right-of-way beneath the Highway 90 bridge. It is difficult to access the boat launch, as it requires vehicles and boat trailers to back onto the ramp from one public street (Twin Bridge Road) across another public street (Down the Bayou Road), blocking both streets simultaneously. This creates a dangerous situation for others traveling through the residential area and can inhibit emergency response vehicles as well. During potential storm surge events the launch is obstructed with flood control barriers (sandbags and HESCO baskets) and unusable by emergency personnel thereby preventing any emergency watercraft rescue efforts. Nearby residents have expressed on social media the need for a new launch. Additionally, the Parish receives numerous complaints regarding the noise pollution caused by vehicles and boats throughout the day and night. The launch has been in existence for many years and has reached the end of its useful life, adding further justification that it is not feasible to make improvements to this launch.

There are two other launches within a five-mile radius of the proposed project site — a boat launch located across Bayou Des Allemands in Lafourche Parish, and the Bayou Gauche boat launch in Bayou Gauche. Boaters can access these launches for a nominal fee, which are all located on private property and offer a total of four ramps. The Hahnville and Pier 90 boat launches are more than 10 aerial miles from the proposed project site and offer four ramps total. Due to the distance of these launches from the water bodies, it would not be practical for recreational boaters and anglers of the southwest region of St. Charles Parish to utilize these launches.

Purpose & Objective: The site of the new launch is in a remote area away from any residential neighborhoods. By relocating the launch, safety will improve within the residential area where the current boat launch exists. The new location will also help remove noise pollution caused by vehicles and boats throughout the day and night. The inadequate capacity of the existing launch would be addressed with multiple ramps and ample parking in the proposed project. The new launch will also be designed to be available to emergency personnel during storm surge events. It will also be ADA-compliant to encourage visitation and participation by all individuals.

In 2021, the Parish accepted a donation of 110 acres of land from Chevron USA Inc where the launch will be located. Future development of the donated property is in the planning phase and the master plan will be focused on incorporating prospective projects for a cultural area, active and passive recreation areas, and a wetland area. The project site is adjacent to an elementary school so integrating educational elements for the

cultural and wetland areas will be a priority. This educational component could also expand the Parish's Swamp School summer program, which is hosted at the Wetland Watchers Park in Norco and in high demand each year.

Land adjacent to the donated property has been approved as a wetland mitigation bank by the US Army Corps of Engineers. In early 2024, almost one million trees will be planted across 5,000 acres of wetlands to create, enhance and preserve the natural features of the surrounding area.

Milestones: The site of the roadway and launch area required the placement of additional dirt, or pre-loading, prior to the construction of the roadway and boat launch. The pre-loading began in the first quarter of 2024 and will require time for settling. The parking lot, boat launch, and complimentary elements are expected to be advertised for bids by the end of first quarter of 2025. The tentative implementation schedule is as follows:


- Pre-Loading & Settling of Roadway Complete 01/2025

- Roadway and Boat Launch Completion 04/2026





No meaningful questions or comments were received.
