The Department of the Treasury's Fiscal Year 2022 Conference Spending Report

In Fiscal Year (FY) 2022, the Treasury Department continued initiatives to oversee conference spending and to ensure that appropriate policies, procedures, and controls were in place to that end. The Department's bureaus continue to follow the Treasury-wide Directive that consolidates and streamlines the conference approval and reporting process and establishes consistent policy for all conference-related activities. The Assistant Secretary for Management, Deputy Secretary, and Secretary have reviewed all conference-related spending as appropriate per policy, and all bureaus have followed established internal policies to ensure that all conference-related activity adhered to appropriate guidelines.

Treasury Department policy allows expenses for conferences only if they are necessary to carry out Treasury's mission and are consistent with specific approval guidelines. In FY 2022, the Treasury Department sponsored meetings and training events to promote economic stability and growth, to strengthen and protect the integrity of the financial system, and to manage the U.S. government's finances.

In accordance with OMB Memorandum M-17-08, below is detail on the Treasury-sponsored conferences in FY 2022 where the net expenses to the Department exceeded \$100,000. This report does not cover conferences sponsored by the Treasury Office of the Inspector General, the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration, the Special Inspector General for the Treasury Asset Relief Program, or the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency.
