

TREASURY OPERATING CASH BALANCE





NET STRIPS AS A PERCENT OF PRIVATELY HELD STRIPPABLE SECURITIES




SECURITIES HELD IN STRIPS FORM

NET NEW CASH FROM NONCOMPETITIVE TENDERS IN WEEKLY BILL AUCTIONS 1/2






NONCOMPETITIVE TENDERS IN TREASURY NOTES AND BONDS 1/




Treasury increased the maximum noncompetitive award to any noncompetitive bidder to \$5 million effective November 5, 1991.


TREASURY NET BORROWING FROM NONMARKETABLE ISSUES




SALES OF UNITED STATES SAVINGS BONDS













QUARTERLY CHANGES IN FOREIGN AND INTERNATIONAL HOLDINGS OF PUBLIC DEBT SECURITIES



NET AWARDS TO FOREIGN OFFICIAL ACCOUNTS 1/



SHORT TERM INTEREST RATES







INTERMEDIATE TERM INTEREST RATES











PRIVATE HOLDINGS OF TREASURY MARKETABLE DEBT BY MATURITY


Percent Distribution By Maturity







Privately held, Excluding Bills
