

Aggregated Perspectives on Treasury Auction Sizes, April 25, 2016

The Treasury Department's Office of Debt Management (ODM) surveyed all 22 primary dealers on April 25, 2016 on their firms' perspectives on current Treasury auction sizes. The results presented below are "trimmed mean" and "trimmed standard deviation". That is, the high and low values of all 22 responses for any maturity tranche are deleted before computing the average and standard deviation.
